Glenmuir FC – Registrations

From March 2018, we will have an online payment option for club registrations, where you can register online via our website www.glenmuirfc.com by clicking the relevant option and by following the steps.

We are encouraging all to Register and pay registrations online, as it will have a huge amount of administration work for both sides, as forms and payments will be processed quicker. The System is powered through Open Play and integrated through our club website. Stripe Payments are used to process the payments which is secure.

Fees are set out as follows:

- Academy (u6-u9s) - €50.00 / €90 for two player families.
- Club Registrations (U10s) - €50.00
- Club Registrations (U11 – U17) - €100.00
- Senior / Reserve - €100.00
- Club Registration (Family two or more) €150.00
- Note: Registrations are Non-refundable.
- €2 per training session / match thereafter.

Registrations Must be paid in full. Registration covers Club Membership, Insurance and goes towards the General running of the club i.e. training equipment, training balls, match balls, pitch maintenance, cost of flood lighting, heating and lighting of the clubhouse, washing of kits, coach training, award presentations, stationary and admin costs etc.

Alternative payment arrangements can be discussed with your team manager.

Players who neglect to pay their annual subscription/membership or non-payment of the payment plan may result in the player's ineligibility to train/play for the club.

I agree to abide by club, league and governing body rules & regulations. I have read, understood and agree to abide by the codes of conduct that is available to view on the Glenmuir FC website www.glenmuirfc.com.

In the event of a medical emergency, and I am uncontactable, I authorise a qualified medical practitioner to provide emergency treatment or medication to my child.

I give permission for my child to be photographed or filmed during club events for reporting or promotion of the sport in club publications and club websites.

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CODE OF CONDUCT

For Everyone

- No abusive language or behavior towards:
 - Glenmuir FC players, Opposition players, Spectators, Coaches/Managers/Club Officials or Referees
- Respect the authority of officials during games and training.
- Never question, or confront officials at games or training.

Players Responsibilities

- Wear all required equipment (shin guards, proper footwear & training gear).
- Pay attention to the coaches when they are speaking and providing instructions on or off the field. Respect the decisions of the referee.
- Be a team player. Learn and develop teamwork, discipline and sportsmanship and practice them.
- Be on time for all games and practices.
- Disrespectful behaviour to coaches, referees or other players will not be tolerated. The use of indecent or profane language is unacceptable.
- Fighting, horseplay or any physical or verbal abuse will not be tolerated.

Parents Responsibilities

- Ensure that your child attends all practices and games. If unable to attend a game or practice, notify the coach and/or manager of the team.
- Arrive on time for training sessions. Ideally ten minutes before the start time.
- Ensure that your child brings all equipment to games and practices. (Shin guards, proper footwear, training gear).
- Support your child's coach and help when you can. Disagreements with your coach do not belong on the field. Questions, input and positive suggestions should be voiced to the coach in the absence of players.
- Parents are encouraged to come and watch but should not shout instructions from the side-lines. This causes confusion. Players should listen for coaches and referee's instructions only.
- Parents and spectators should remain behind the side-lines. Under no circumstances should parents or spectators go on the field before, during, or in between games.
- Parents are expected to set a good example for the children at all times by their positive behaviour, sportsmanship, attitude and language. **Abusive language, behaviour or physical assault of any kind will not tolerated.**
- Parents are expected to demonstrate respect for the referees.
